



Youth Services ActiveDay

Participants attending Active Day of Defiance have been busy taking part in a variety of activities and learning new skills.

Community integration is a key component of the program. They encourage participants to engage with their local communities through volunteer opportunities, community events, and partnerships with local organizations. This not only enhances participants' social connections but also fosters a sense of belonging and contribution.

Another area of focus is providing comprehensive life skills that covers essential areas such cooking and personal hygiene. Their hands-on approach ensures that participants gain practical skills they can use every day, enhancing their ability to live independently and effectively manage their routines.

Engaging in social and recreational activities is a vital part of the program. They offer a variety of group activities, including arts and crafts, music therapy, and community outings. These activities not only provide enjoyment but also encourage social interaction, teamwork, and personal growth.

Lymphoma

Lymphoma is a cancer of the Lymphatic system of the body involving immune cells. These causes swelling of the lymph nodes in the neck, armpit or groin, fever, night sweats, difficulty breathing, and weight loss. This condition is very rare, since there are less than 20,000 cases per year. It is more common in males and a family history may increase likelihood.

Lymphoma is a cancer of the lymphatic system. The lymphatic system is part of the germ-fighting and disease-fighting immune system. Lymphoma begins when healthy cells in the lymphatic system change and grow out of control.

The lymphatic system includes the lymph nodes, which are found throughout the body. Most are in the abdomen, chest, neck, pelvis, chest, and underarms. This system also includes the spleen, thymus, tonsils and bone marrow.





Ohio P2P is an evidence-based statewide parent support program that matches parents, siblings, self-advocates, foster parents, grandparents, etc. who have family members of any age, with a disability or special healthcare need, to an experienced, trained, volunteer support parent.



Training is comprised of two one-hour zoom sessions and a set of four online modules to complete on your own during the weeks in between. Total time commitment for the training is around 4 hours, including the zoom sessions.

The two one-hour zoom sessions are held on the first and fourth Thursday of each month. You may choose the time that best fits your schedule, either 12pm-1pm OR 6:30-7:30pm.
