#### The Epilepsy Center of Northwest Ohio

**Representative Payee Services** 

The Epilepsy Center of Northwest Ohio offers Payee Services. This service enables an individual to have his or her financial obligations managed when they can no longer do so for themselves or when they have no other person to take on this necessity. An individual's income benefits are carefully monitored so that debts/bills are paid in a timely manner.

The current financial benefit received by the individual must be transferred to the Epilepsy Center to become their Representative Payee. This is usually their Social Security benefits. After processing the appropriate paperwork, that agency or person will name the Epilepsy Center as payee and the financial benefit will come directly to us. We provide the service to make this payee transition, if needed. A checking account is opened in the client's name and all financial obligations can be redirected to their Center via regular mail or fax for payment. Each client can have a monthly financial recap available for review, if so desired.

The Henry County Abilities Resource Council has been busy providing fun, enriching outings that bring our community together! Here's a look at some of the exciting events our members have enjoyed recently:



## THE HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (HEAP) CAN HELP!

HEAP is a federally funded program managed by the Ohio Department of Development to help income-eligible households with winter heating costs. Households at or below 175% of the federal income level (see chart) may receive a credit once per winter heating season towards their primary heating source—electric, natural gas, or bulk fuel.

#### Three ways to apply until May 31, 2025:

- Online at www.energyhelp.ohio.gov
- Appointment with your local Energy Assistance
  Provider (community action agency)
- Mail in an Energy Assistance application\*
- from www.energyhelp.ohio.gov

Mailed applications may take 12-16 weeks to process. HEAP benefits start being applied in January. Always sign, date, and provide all required documents to avoid delay

Team #1 was the winner with their incredible pumpkin sundae masterpiece!



## **Special Olympics**

It's already October. Where has 2024 gone? October means the winding down of fall sports. We had two official teams for flag football this year. Team 1 and Team 2 both competed at the Special Olympics Ohio Northwest Regional tournament on Saturday, October 5. Napoleon City Schools generously allowed us to use Charles Buckenmeyer Stadium for this event. Twelve teams traveled to Napoleon from ten counties in the Northwest Region. The fun tournament this year used a double elimination bracket style that allowed teams to practice for the upcoming State Championship Flag Football. Team 1 (which is was the team

headed to the state championship) placed 1<sup>st</sup> in their division, and Team 2 which also had athletes from Williams County Special Olympics joined in also placed 1<sup>st</sup> in their division. We were honored to host this first ever tournament

for the Northwest Region, and we look forward to hosting it again in 2025.

This year we are becoming more involved unified volleyball along with the Wood County Special Olympics. Back in the spring we played with them to form a team to practice with other counties. Unified sports are sports that pairs athletes with and without intellectual disabilities together on the same team. They work together in a spirit of inclusion compete. The entire month of October we have traveled to compete unified and get some practice for this new volleyball team we will be forming. On the weekend of October 18-20, we traveled with Flag football Team 1 to Geneva, Ohio to attend the 2024 Special Olympics Ohio Flag Football Championships. We competed both Saturday and Sunday. On Saturday, the Cougars clawed their way to a win against Lucas County 42-37. Sunday put the Cougars vs. the Pickerington County



Jaguars. The Cougars fought hard and came out on top 50-34. That brings the Cougars home with Back-to-Back Gold finishes to Henry County! We are very proud of all the athletes and how they never gave up. Over the weekend we had a great time making memories together hanging out at the lake and with our friends from Defiance County Special Olympics. We had a BBQ and costume contest.

The Athlete Leadership Council for Henry County has been busy planning for activities in October and November. They took part in the HOPE Services/Soaring Arts Trunk or Treat, creating 2 trunks representing Alice in Wonderland. They are also working hard planning and decorating a tree for donation to the Symphony of Trees in November. They even volunteered to be scarers at the Maumee Valley Civic Theater Haunted Trail at Oakwood Park. They are very excited to become more involved in other Henry County organizations and give back to the community that continues to support them.

Basketball cheerleading has started in preparation for the upcoming season. This year we will have a basketball cheer squad, as well as a competition cheer squad. The addition of this new team will provide more opportunities for athletes who are unable to compete to still be able to cheer at all our local games. They will have a busy winter season. We had a very short Flag Football cheer season, and hopefully next year, we will be able to add Flag Football cheer as an option for athletes. We want to give a big shout out to those volunteers that stepped up to coach these

two teams this year!! Candy Heath, Krysta Delgado, and Lydia Knepper put a lot of time into creating cheers and helping our team learn them. Be sure to come out and cheer on the Cougars at a Home game and see what the basketball cheer squad has done!!

Our basketball teams have started practices. They are having a great time meeting new players and seeing old friends again. We will have 4 teams again this year. We have a school age, two Men's teams at different division levels, and a Ladies basketball team. If you want to play, and haven't signed up yet, make sure to contact us. There is still time to join. You can also still sign up for swimming and competition cheer.

Competition swimming starts November 7. We will be practicing at the YMCA in Defiance, on Wednesday and Thursday evenings. This is for athlete safety. You must be able to swim a full lap without touching the bottom to participate in competition swimming. Competition Cheerleading starts December 9.





## "World Diabetes Day"

The blue symbol is the universal symbol for diabetes and its adoption as the symbol for diabetes awareness and advocacy can be traced back to the efforts of the International Diabetes Foundation (IDF). The blue circle was introduced in 2007 as part of the World Diabetes Day campaign. The choice of the blue color was inspired by the blue border of the flag of the United Nations, symbolizing the global unity and solidarity in the fight against diabetes. The blue circle represents the unity of the diabetes community worldwide, and it serves as a symbol to raise awareness about the disease and advocate for better care, prevention and research.

The IDF encourages individuals to use the blue circle to promote diabetes awareness and education. World Diabetes Day is an international observance day held on the 14th of November each year. It was introduced by the IDF and the World Health Organization in1991 in response to the growing concerns about the escalating health threat posed by diabetes.



In May 1921, Fredrick Banting met in John Macleod's lab to begin their experiments with insulin. In January 1922, the first person received an insulin injection. By 1923, insulin was commercially available. Banting and Macleod received the 1923 Nobel Peace prize for their discovery.
