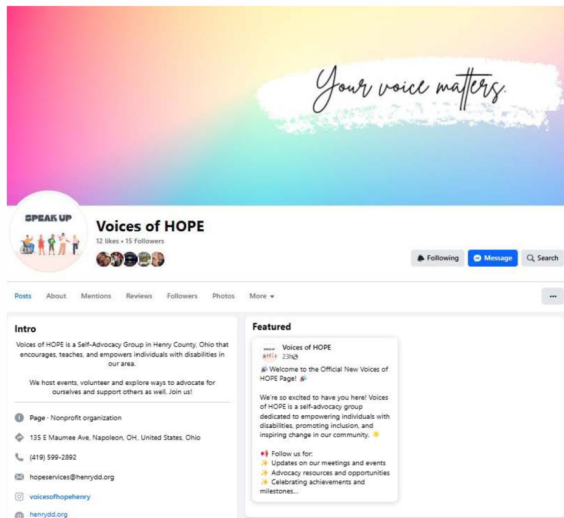

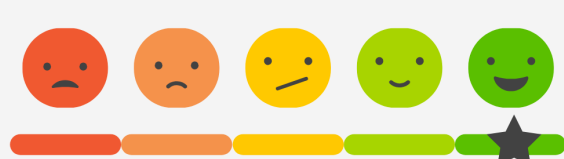

The European Organization for Rare Diseases established this day in 2008 to raise awareness for unknown or overlooked diseases. According to that organization, treatment for many rare diseases is insufficient, as well as the social networks to support people with rare diseases and their families, and since there are already numerous days dedicated to specific diseases (such as aids, cancer, etc.) there was no day previously for those affected by rare diseases.

The first Rare Disease Day was coordinated by the European Organization for Rare Diseases (EURORDIS) and held on February 29, 2008.

I'm excited to share this month's "Ryan's Restaurant Review." This time, we explored the wonderful Reelwood Kitchen located at 455 Airport Highway in Wauseon, Ohio.

Introducing Reelwood Kitchen

Located in Wauseon in the Skye Cinema building, Reelwood Kitchen is more than a restaurant; it's an adventure. This place offers a welcoming atmosphere and a creative menu in a cozy and rustic setting. You can enjoy the restaurant, or order food to enjoy during a movie!

Review of Appetizers

We started with some mouth-watering appetizers. The Crispy Mushrooms were fresh and flavorful, served with Cajun aioli sauce. The Homemade Deviled Eggs were topped with crispy bacon and green onions and were so delicious. The Fiesta style jalapeno pepper poppers were quickly devoured before we took photos and were especially tasty. I would highly recommend getting at least one appetizer before your meal.

Review of Entrees

EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENINGS NORTHWEST OHIO

In Ohio, all 3 to 5 year old children are required to complete an Early Childhood Screening prior to entering local public school preschool.
